



Peace and Conflict Studies (PCS)
2012 Admissions Information – Master of Arts (MA) Degree Program

PCS is an interdisciplinary research and study program at Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (TUFS), created to attract international students and researchers at the graduate level who are interested in exploring diverse topics that fall within the emerging discipline of Peace and Conflict Studies. In the 2004 academic year, TUFS began to offer a concentration in Peace and Conflict Studies within its 2-year Master of Arts (International Studies) Degree Program. English is the primary language of instruction for all courses within the PCS curriculum, but students may also explore other courses offered at TUFS in Japanese and various languages including basic to advanced language training. Outstanding international and Japanese applicants are invited to apply for the Master of Arts Degree Program commencing in the 2012 academic year as follows:

*In case the entrance fee and tuition shall be amended at the time of entrance and during enrollment, the new entrance fee and tuition shall be applied.

Eligibility:

Applicants must meet one of the following criteria upon application:

- 1. You have graduated or are expected to graduate from a Japanese university in March 2012.**
- 2. You have obtained a Bachelor's degree according to the Clause 4 of Article 104 in the School Education Law of Japan (Gakko Kyouiku Hou) or are expected to obtain such degree by March 2012.**
- 3. You have completed 16 years of education at an educational institution outside Japan or are expected to complete such course by March 2012.**



4. You have completed 16 years of education at an education institution outside Japan or are expected to complete such course by March 2012 through taking classes of the correspondence course of such institution in Japan.
5. You have completed or expect to complete by March 2012 a course in Japan at a foreign educational institution (a graduate of which must be deemed to have completed a 16-year course in the school education system of that country), which is recognized to have university courses in the educational system of such and specifically so designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology
6. You have completed the specialized course specifically designated by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology after such designation or are expected to do so by March 2012 at a vocational school, whose minimum period required for graduation is four years or longer, and which also satisfies other conditions specified by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.
7. You have been designated as eligible by the Minister of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology.
8. You have been screened separately for eligibility and approved by the graduate School of this university as having the academic ability equivalent of that of a student who has graduated from an university and you will be aged 22 or older as of March 31, 2012.

* In case you are not sure whether you are eligible to apply or not, please send a full detailed academic history (including month/year you started and completed each institution) to pcs@tufs.ac.jp by 30 November, 2011.

In addition, applicants specifically to the Master of Arts (International Studies) Degree Program with a concentration in Peace and Conflict Studies are expected to have an undergraduate degree in a relevant field from the social sciences or humanities, and ideally some related professional experience. International or cross-cultural exposure will also be highly assessed. Through the application process, applicants should demonstrate a genuine interest in and commitment to issues relevant to the field of Peace and Conflict Studies, and potential for future academic and professional success. This includes evidence of the applicant’s motivation to work independently and capacity to design and carry out original research. Each applicant may also submit with the application materials one additional academic or professional publication he or she wishes the Admissions Committee to consider. If you have a preferred academic supervisor at TUFS (PCS), please write down his/her name on the application. However, another supervisor may become your supervisor after PCS committee reviews your research topic. With regards to language skills, all non-native speakers of English are asked to present their test scores on the major English proficiency exams (taken within the last 2 years). Generally speaking, it would be desirable to have the following minimum score to academically succeed in our program:

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Applicants must submit all documents listed on the Application Checklist (following page) to the Admissions Office at TUFS before the specified deadline. Alterations to the contents of application documents will not be allowed after they have been submitted, and the Application Fee is non-refundable. Additionally, all materials submitted should contain only factual and honest information, and should include the applicant's own work only (i.e. any sort of plagiarism will immediately disqualify an applicant). Applicants who are found to have misrepresented any information or documents in their Application after having commenced their studies at TUFS will be asked to leave the university.

After all application documents have been received, they will then be evaluated by faculty members to gauge the overall suitability and potential of each applicant to benefit from and contribute to graduate study at PCS. Interview will then be held. For applicants residing outside of Japan, an interview will be held through internet based telephone such as Skype. Those applicants residing in Japan at the time of submitting the application are required to attend an in-person interview with the Admissions Committee at TUFS campus in Tokyo, Japan. Admissions results will be posted on the PCS website (applicants will be emailed the internet address for a secure web page where they can view the results once they are available) and each applicant will also receive a formal admissions notification letter through regular mail. Telephone inquiries are not accepted. Applicants who are granted admission to the MA Degree Program will be provided with relevant information concerning necessary procedures and documentation for enrollment and registration, immigration and other issues, shortly after receiving the official admissions letter. The University's Administrative Offices will be open for Enrollment and Registration from early March. However, successful applicants who plan to enter our program in April will be requested to submit a pledge (stating that he/she will complete the entrance procedure by end of March) by 9 March 2012. Such details will be explained within the documents relative to entrance procedure.

Thematic Essay

Please choose one of the following themes and write an analytical essay of up to 5 pages (maximum 1,500 words). The essay should consist of two parts: (1) a general and analytical discussion of the theme you have chosen and (2) your perspective on the theme in the very context of your research proposal. Your essay will be used to assess the current levels of your analytical skills and knowledge of issues relating to - Peace and Conflict Studies, as well as your ability to communicate your ideas.

- 1) The sources of conflict and peace in a globalized age
- 2) The role of international organizations in peace-building
- 3) Conflict and coexistence within and between societies

Personal Statement

Write a Personal Statement (essay) focusing on your past experiences and current and future interests as well as any other information that you would like to bring to the Admission Committee's attention. Your Statement should demonstrate your suitability and future potential to research and work in areas related to Peace and Conflict Studies. We encourage you to be creative in how you organize and present your thoughts, but please be concrete and detailed, and stay within 3 pages (maximum 1,000 words)

Address some of the following points/questions within your Personal Statement:

- Describe your academic, professional, and relevant personal experience, highlighting anything you have done or been involved in related to Peace and Conflict Studies.
- How have these experiences led you to develop an interest in this field?
- Why would you like to study Peace and Conflict Studies in Japan? At Tokyo University of Foreign Studies?
- What are the most important skills/knowledge/experiences that you hope to gain through this program?
- What unique or valuable perspective(s) can you offer given the diversity of faculty and students in the program?
- What personal qualities do you have that make you well suited to work in this area in the future, and how are these reflected in your past experiences and accomplishments?
- How do you intend to use what you learn at TUFS in the future, both personally and professionally?
- Specifically, what do you see yourself doing 5-10 years after having graduated from PCS?

Research Proposal

Submit a short proposal outlining your intended research topic for the thesis component of the MA Degree Program, including a title. The proposal should identify and provide background information about a specific topic or question that you are interested in researching at TUFS, clearly explain why you think this topic is important to explore, and suggest a preliminary research design specifying any case(s) you plan to focus on, the type of research method(s) you plan to utilize, and any related fieldwork you plan to undertake. Please also include some discussion of the primary literature you have reviewed in regards to your topic, including a list of major references (books, scholarly articles, and academic papers). You are asked to choose 2 of the listed references, summarize their contents, relate them to your research theme, and explain why you consider these references as important for your own argument. Again, please try to be as concrete and detailed as possible, but stay within 5 pages (maximum 1,500 words)
