Regulations Concerning the Implementation of the Double Degree Program Between Tokyo University of Foreign Studies and University of Central Lancashire

(June 16, 2021
Regulation No. 3 of the School of Japan
Studies)

Article 1 Purpose

These Regulations shall provide for necessary matters relating to the Double Degree Program (hereinafter referred to as “DDP”) to be implemented between the School of Japan Studies of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (hereinafter referred to as the “University”) and the Asia Pacific Studies of University of Central Lancashire (hereinafter referred to as “UCLan”) under the agreement executed between the University and UCLan.

Article 2 DDP

DDP means a program in which a student enrolled in the School of Japan Studies of the University is admitted to the Asia Pacific Studies of UCLan while enrolled in the University or a student enrolled in the Asia Pacific Studies of UCLan is admitted to the School of Japan Studies of the University while enrolled in UCLan, acquires the credits prescribed by the University and UCLan, and is awarded the degree specified by each of the University and UCLan.

Article 3 Study Abroad by Student of University and Accreditation

- 1 The students enrolled in the School of Japan Studies of the University who take the DDP (hereinafter referred to as the "University Students") shall study abroad at the Asia Pacific Studies of UCLan and acquire the prescribed credits.
- 2 The period of study abroad of the University Students shall be one (1) year, in principle. However, this shall not apply if it is found that there are particular circumstances.
- 3 The University Students shall take three (3) compulsory courses and two (2) elective courses from among the courses set forth in the Appended Table to be offered by the Asia Pacific Studies of UCLan and shall acquire one hundred twenty (120) credits.
- 4 Credits earned by the University Students in the Asia Pacific Studies of UCLan shall be recognized as credits for the School of Japan Studies of the University in each of the course categories listed in the Appended Table.
- 5 The Guidelines for Overseas Study of Undergraduate Schools of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies shall apply mutatis mutandis to the procedures, etc. for the accreditation of credits.

Article 4 Acceptance of Students Enrolled in UCLan and Accreditation of Credits

- 1 Students enrolled in the Asia Pacific Studies of UCLan who take DDP (hereinafter referred to as

"UCLan Students") shall transfer to the third year of the School of Japan Studies of the University and acquire the prescribed credits.

- 2 If a UCLan Student is admitted to the School of Japan Studies of the University, the Student shall be deemed to have taken sixty-two (62) credits for the class subjects as set forth in Article 7, Appended Table 3 of the Guidelines for Approval of Credits Already Obtained, etc. Before Admission to Undergraduate School of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies.

Article 5 University Graduation Requirements

- 1 The University Students and UCLan Students shall acquire necessary credits in accordance with the categories specified by the School of Japan Studies of the University and shall acquire a total of one hundred twenty-five (125) credits or more.
- 2 Those who have earned the credits in the preceding paragraph and satisfied other requirements for graduation shall be granted a bachelor's degree (in Language, Area and Culture Studies).

Article 6 UCLan Graduation Requirements

The requirements to graduate UCLan shall be in accordance with the regulations, etc. established by UCLan.

Article 7 Miscellaneous Provisions

Any matters not set forth in these Regulations shall be prescribed separately.

Note Students shall make sure to take the compulsory courses "1." through "3." and acquire eighty (80) credits and shall take two (2) courses, in principle, from among the elective courses "4." through "13." and acquire forty (40) credits. However, with respect to the elective courses for forty (40) credits, students may take courses (subjects) offered in the courses other than the Asia Pacific Studies and count them as a part or all of such forty (40) credits, and those credits shall be accepted as the related courses of the School of Japan Studies of the University up to eight (8) credits according to the number of credits acquired.
