Tokyo University of Foreign Studies General Rules for Undergraduate Schools

Article 1 Purpose

These regulations provide for necessary matters concerning the School of Language and Culture Studies, School of International and Area Studies and School of Japan Studies (collectively, the “Schools”) in accordance with the provisions of Article 15, Paragraph 4 of the Organization Regulations of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies .

Article 2 Registration Procedure

Students must complete the course registration procedures for each semester by the prescribed date.
2. If a student registers for more than one course at the same time in the same semester, all courses may be invalidated.

Article 3 Regular Examinations, Additional Examinations and Follow-up Examinations

Regular examinations are held at the end of each semester. However, for intensive courses, examinations are held at the end of the course concerned.
2.Regular examinations may be replaced by reports, etc.
3.The date, schedule, and other necessary matters for regular examinations shall be determined separately.
4.The faculty member in charge of the course may set occasional additional examinations if deemed necessary for teaching purposes.
5. A follow-up examination may be set for students who are unable to take the regular examination due to illness, accident, or other special circumstances.

Article 4 Misconduct

Any student who is found to have committed misconduct in any examination as stipulated in the preceding article shall fail all courses taken in the same semester or academic year.
2. In addition to the preceding paragraph, the student may be subject to disciplinary punishment as stipulated in Article 47 of the University Regulations of Tokyo University of Foreign Studies (the “University Regulations”).

Article 5 Approval of Credits

The result of the examination stipulated in Article 3, state of academic progress, and other learning

achievement, etc. are comprehensively evaluated, and the prescribed credits shall be awarded to those who pass.

2. Credits are awarded at the end of the semester, at the end of the academic year, or at the end of an intensive course.

3. As a general rule, the approval of credits is notified either before or after the start of the Fall Quarter or at the end of the academic year. However, if the Dean deems it necessary, notification may be made outside of this period.

4. The grading scheme and pass/fail grades are shown in the following table.

5. Notwithstanding the preceding item, credits awarded in accordance with Articles 33 to 36 of the University Regulations shall be denoted as "Approved".

6. No credits can be canceled or grades changed.

7. Necessary matters related to the evaluation of grades shall be determined separately.

8. Credits for special audit students and other necessary matters shall be determined separately.

Article 6 Class Times

Class times are as follows.

2. Class times for intensive courses and supplementary lectures shall be determined on a case-by-case basis.

Article 7 Graduation Date

Graduation is at the end of March for entrants at the beginning of the Spring Quarter and at the end of September for entrants at the beginning of the Fall Quarter.

2. Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, students who have been enrolled for more than the degree program length and meet the graduation requirements stipulated in Article 44 of the University Regulations may graduate at the end of September if they enrolled at the beginning of the Spring Quarter, or at the end of March if they enrolled at the beginning of the Fall Quarter.

Article 8 Amendments

Any amendments to these regulations must be approved by a two-thirds majority of those present at a Faculty Meeting for each School.
